IMPORTANT information for term 4:

- 26 October Prize-giving (mainly for Grade 12s)
- 4 November Grade 10 -11 Parents' consultation 17h00 – 19h00
- 5 November Grade 10 – 11 exams start

- 8 – 18 November school finishes at 13h00 for Grade 8 and 9 pupils (and at 12h00 on Friday 12 and 19 November)
- 22 – 26 November exams start for Grade 8 – 9 pupils and they go home at 12h00.
- Gr 8 – 11 26 November they go home after their exam.
- 29 November **compulsory** tabloid sport (07h30 – 10h00) and leadership development day (10h30 – 13h00)
- 30 November **compulsory** tabloid sport (07h30 – 10h00) and returning of scripts (10h30 – 13h00)
- 1 December **compulsory** returning of scripts 07h30 – 10h30. Final assembly 10h30 – 11h30

The last few days after the exam are compulsory school days. There will be detention on the last day and penalties will be issued if pupils do not come to school.
