

Admission Policy

- 1. No child will be refused admission to PEPPS Polokwane Preparatory School and College on the grounds of race or religious belief. Please bear in mind PEPPS has a Christian ethos.
- 2. All children seeking admission to the school must pass the proficiency test. The minimum requirement for English is 40% and for Mathematics is 50% (Grade 4-11).
- 3. In the best interest of the children, only applicants turning 7 years old in their Grade 1 year are eligible for consideration for a position in Grade 1. This also applies to subsequent grades.
- 4. All applicants granted admission to the school will be expected to abide by the Policies, Practices and Procedures of the school.
- 5. All applicants will be expected to participate in all compulsory school events and extra-curricular activities offered at the school.
- 6. All parents will abide by the promotion requirements of the school.
- 7. Where selection becomes necessary because the number of successful applicants exceeds the number of available spaces, selection shall be based on the following criteria:
 - 7.1. Preference will be given to applicants based on their performance in the proficiency test.
 - 7.2. Preference will be given to siblings, except where this is not in the best interests of the applicant or the applicant has not passed the proficiency test.
 - 7.3. Preference will be given to applicants with a record of involvement in, or who demonstrate an interest in, one or more of the cultural and sporting activities which form part of this school's extra-curricular programme.
 - 7.4. Preference will be given to applicants who have attended the school before or are children of past pupils of the school.
 - 7.5. The capacity of the school to provide an acceptable quality of education to the applicant (this applies particularly to applicants with special needs and barriers to learning).
 - 7.6. The requirements of the credit check must be met.
 - 7.7. Interviews with applicants will be requested, but do not guarantee a place.
 - 7.8. In consultation with the Board of Trustees, the Head's decision is final and no further negotiations will be entered into.
- 8. All <u>successful</u> applicants will be expected to produce a current (no older than 3 months) auditory and visual screening (vision and hearing test). The office can be contacted for further information.
